Established in 1913 as a concert hall of the Greater Berlin Builders' Association, it nowadays serves, thanks to its excellent acoustics, as a recording studio for major artists, as well as a conference venue.


### **The City of Berlin**

Berlin is the capital city and one of the 16 federal states of Germany. With a population of 3.4 million, Berlin is Germany's largest city. Following German reunification in 1990, the city regained its status as the capital of Germany and seat of the German 2-chamber parliament and the federal government.

Berlin is a world city of culture, politics, media and science. Its economy is primarily based on the service sector, encompassing a diverse range of creative industries, media corporations, congress and convention venues. Other industries include optoelectronics, traffic engineering, IT, renewable energy, pharmaceuticals, biomedical engineering and biotechnology.

Berlin is one of the most visited tourist destinations in the EU. The Potsdamer Platz, the Memorials to the Murdered Jews of Europe and for the Persecuted Homosexuals, Sinti and Roma, as well as Brandenburg gate and the Reichstag (parliament), are all within walking distance of the GSF venue which used to be located right next to the Berlin Wall.
